But now Beth has embarked on a new adventure. She is doing research for a new book that takes her family line back to the 10th century over in England. Beth had the help of her sister, an avid genealogist in her own right. Some of the information she was getting were historical facts. She is so lucky to have some famous relatives in her past. The further back she goes though, there are some conflicts in dates and stories. Beth believes that it's like looking at a puzzle that she wants to solve.

Beth likes to see if she can find information in books. If she does, then she looks at the footnotes to see where the fact came from and she also uses the bibliography to see what books were used. She then works back through those sources. One great place that she likes to use is the Internet Archive. It is a free source and can be found at archive.org. Doing an Exhaustive Search (the first step in the Genealogical Proof Standard) is trying to find as many sources as possible and Beth finds the research is really fun! When looking at Family Trees online, she takes information with a grain of salt.

If she can't solve this brick wall, Beth has decided to put it aside for a while. "I'll come back, after Christmas, with fresh eyes," Beth said. That is another great idea when researching.

Even drawings and portraits Beth takes with a grain of salt. The family crests are consistent though. They have similar things within them. After she is done writing, Beth would like to research the family crests.

Beth has also found that Historical Societies are useful and she is just getting ready for parish detail research information and hopes to find some original sources. Records that she is looking at are before the 1500's and records are scarce. Keep us informed if you can break through this brick wall. Good luck!

### SGS FIELD TRIP -- SEPT. 26, 2023

Seven members of the society visited the Family History Center in Tucson for a field trip for our September meeting. It is a small facility packed with resources. They concentrate on their search engine, now called Family Search, as well as Ancestry.com, Find My Past, and My Heritage. Their employees are very knowledgeable and ready to assist anyone with help finding their roots. All the help is free and you can drop in anytime to ask questions, They teach classes —free with registration necessary.

The Family Search has a database of 16.8 billion records plus 550,000 keywordsearchable digitized books. For the visit we had some lively discussions and fascinating questions from our members. It's really valuable to have interesting questions (they raise other questions!) from the group. Everyone who attended learned something about how to use the research available and all agreed that it was a very welcoming place to go to get assistance with your family search.

The very smallness of the facility made it easy to fit right into the informal ambience. All visitors expressed their appreciation for the service and care they were given.



# >>> MY HERITAGE

Your SGS membership includes access to MyHeritage. It's a great addition to your usual research tools. It costs about \$200/year for individual membership. You can access it for FREE on the MEMBERS ONLY page of the SGS website. Forget the password? Call a board member! According to Diahan Southard, DNA educator, MyHeritage is especially good if you're looking for relatives and ancestors outside the United States. MyHeritage is known for strong international resources. They have curated impressive record collections for many parts of Europe (think France, Germany, United Kingdom, Ireland, Spain, Sweden. Denmark and more). Their collections are growing for other places around the world, too, including Latin America and Oceania. It's the only genealogy website available in 42 languages, which means that fellow descendants who may still speak the language of your homeland may be using MyHeritage.
